#### Logistics

- Dates, inclusive of travel: January 3 16, 2016
  - You must arrive in Coyhaique by the evening of January 4th, which means you will most likely need to depart the U.S. on January 3rd
  - You can depart Chile on January 15th, most likely arriving in the U.S. on January 16th
  - Expedition dates are <u>not</u> flexible. You must be present for the duration of the expedition
  - If you are a first-year student, you must make sure your planned immersion does not start until after January 16th
- Program Fees: Round-trip airfare to Patagonia
  (tickets range from \$1,200-\$2,000), plus a program
  fee of \$2,200, and some gear\* and on-the-ground
  expenses. Check with Lisa Pastrick to see if you
  qualify for loans to help cover the costs of the trip.
