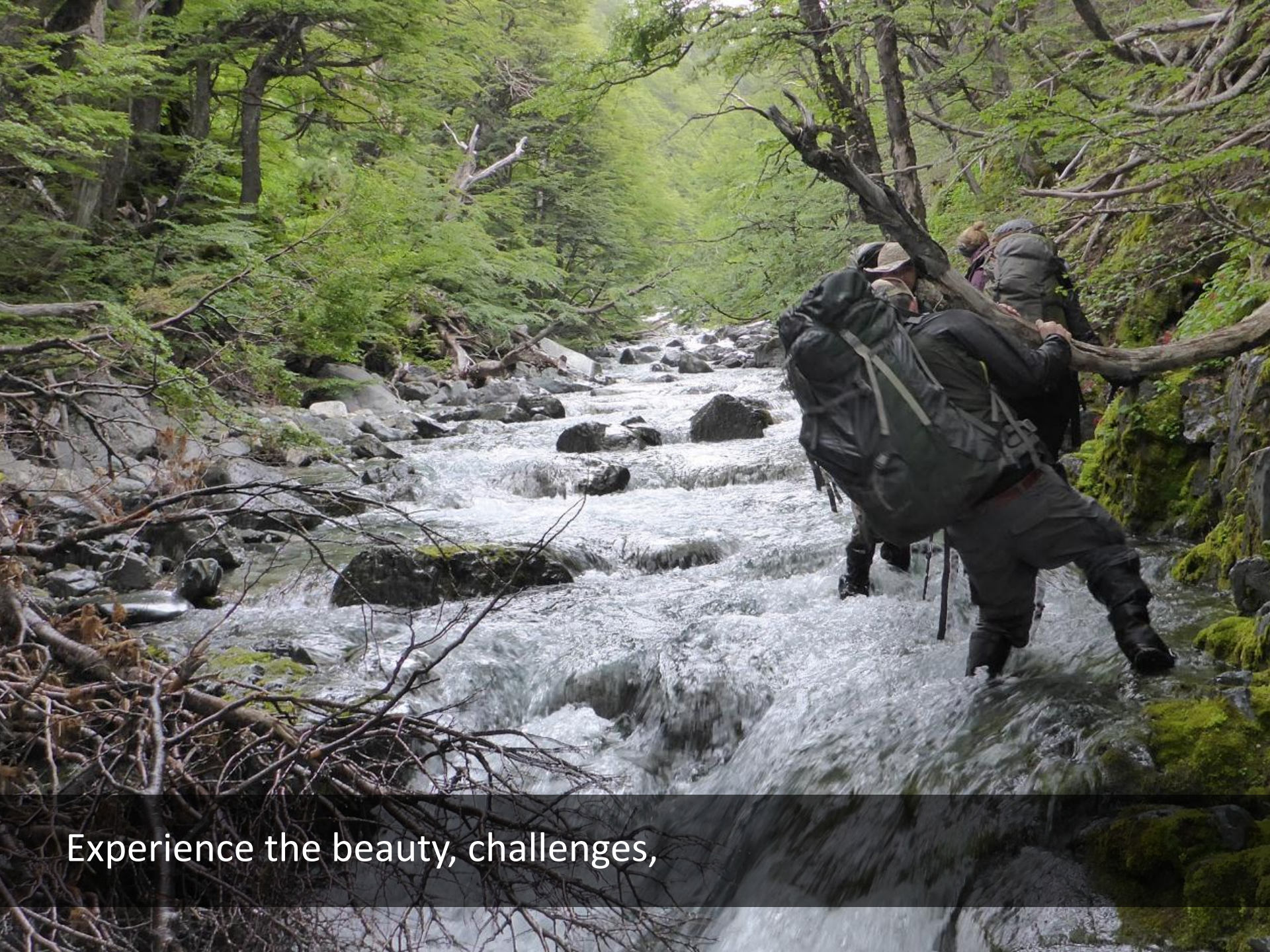

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The Outdoor Classroom Experience

 - be forced to make decisions with incomplete, inconclusive, and/or conflicting information
 - receive real-time feedback and coaching on your leadership efforts.

Academic Credit

- Mandatory pre- and post-expedition sessions
- 1-2 pre-sessions focused on:
 - Active followership & peer leadership
 - Decision-making
 - Coping with stress
- 1-2 post sessions focused on:
 - Coaching and transference
- Deliverable:
 - Post-trip reflective essay outlining one transfer goal and one development goal





Logistics

- ***Dates, inclusive of travel:*** January 3 - 16, 2016
 - You must arrive in Coyhaique by the evening of January 4th, which means you will most likely need to depart the U.S. on January 3rd
 - You can depart Chile on January 15th, most likely arriving in the U.S. on January 16th
 - Expedition dates are not flexible. You must be present for the duration of the expedition
 - If you are a first-year student, you must make sure your planned immersion does not start until after January 16th
- ***Program Fees:*** Round-trip airfare to Patagonia (tickets range from \$1,200-\$2,000), plus a program fee of \$2,200, and some gear* and on-the-ground expenses. Check with Lisa Pastrick to see if you qualify for loans to help cover the costs of the trip.
